Layoffs Announced By the Xerox Corp. Of 580 Workers

The Xerox Corporation said yesterday it had laid off an additional 580 workers at its computer operations at El Segundo, Calif.

A company spokesman said that since July, when Xerox announced it was withdrawing from the mainframe computer business, Xerox had laid off more than 1,200 of the 4,100

employees involved in computer operations.

GTE Plans a Layoff

SENECA FALLS, N.Y., Oct. 13 (AP)—About 200 employees of the GTE Sylvania, Inc., plant here will be laid off by the end of this month, a company spokesman said today.

Robert Peters, plant manager, said the layoffs were necessitated by decreased television sales.

The plant is headquarters for the company's research and engineering activity, as well as manufacturing center for picture tubes for color televisions.

Last year, 200 workers at the plant were laid off. Total

employment at the plant will be down to about 1,000 after this month's layoffs.

"We hope the economy will improve to some extent so that some of these people can be recalled," said Mr. Peters.

Farah Reopens Plant

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Oct. 13 (UPI)—The Farah Manufacturing Company reopened today one of two San Antonio plants it had closed last March. The company said renewed demand and overall economic conditions enabled it to start limited production with 75 workers.

The plant had peak employ-

ment of 950 workers, and regional plant manager Lionel Pierce said 200 workers should be back on the job by next week.

Mr. Pierce said no specific date was set for full employment again at the plant and that there were no immediate plans to reopen the other Farah installation. Farah manufactures men's slacks and leisure wear. It is headquartered in El Paso where five plants employ more than 7,000 workers.

"We hope to fill the building as soon as possible," Mr. Pierce said of the reopened plant. "It all depends on our sales, of course, and the outlook is very good."
